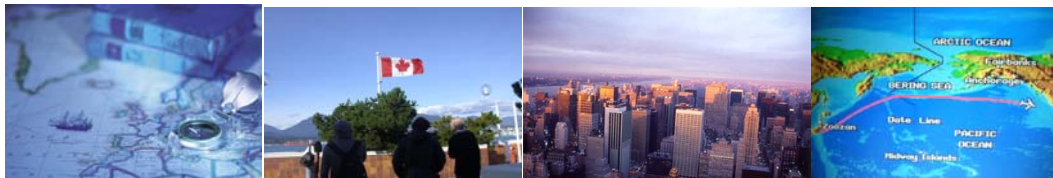


# Department of International Culture

## 3 Areas and 3 Abilities

Students focus on three areas of study in order to become internationally-minded citizens.

## International Liberal Arts

Japanese society is expecting college graduates to be educated with an international outlook. Students in this department study international issues, the world's cultural heritage, life environments, culture, literature, media, and foreign languages. This course of study enables graduates to be active at home and abroad.



## International Communication

Students can improve their English ability through our practical, hands-on programs, such as "English Camp," "Home Stay with a Foreign Family in Tokyo," "Study Abroad Programs," and "Best World Scholarship." The "Best World Scholarship" is a unique program offered only by Tokyo Junshin Women's College through which students are able to design individualized study abroad programs.



## English Education for Children

The courses in this area are focused on English education for children. As a pioneer in this field, Tokyo Junshin Women's College has developed a unique internship program with the cooperation of local elementary schools. Through this program, students are able to gain experience teaching English at public elementary schools. Moreover, the Department offers practical experience-based learning programs, such as "English classes for children," in which students teach English for the elementary students who visit the College, and "English Camp for Children," in which students set up and run an English camp for children. Students are also able to obtain a teacher's license in three levels - elementary, junior and senior high schools.

## Department of Fine Arts and Culture



The Department of Fine Arts and Culture aims to foster talented individuals who can contribute to society through the following three courses of study: Music, Art, and Environmental Art and Design.

### Music Course

In this course, students focus on studying the basics of music, such as voice, piano, and organ, and also develop a solid understanding of music theory. We aim to foster individuals who can be active as music teachers and also as leaders in the business world by applying their developed sense of worth and expressiveness.



### Art Course

In this course, students focus on studying the fundamentals of painting (Japanese painting and oil painting) and design (product, visual, and computer graphics). We aim to foster individuals who can apply their skills in the fields of design, art education, and in graduate studies as well as study abroad programs.



### Environmental Art and Design

In this course, students focus on studying the practical skills of planning and carrying out art exhibitions, concerts, and other cultural events. We aim to foster individuals who can work in various art-related fields, such as artistic display design and art management.
